## PLEASE READ BEFORE YOU START:

- You can start the game at any point. It is best to end the game at point number 8.
- The map in this leaflet and the point markings in the park colourful silhouettes of nuthatches placed in the Łazienki gardens – will help you find the points.
- A password made up of the answers to the tasks is the keyword that will enable you to access the website, where you will find some eco-tips. Important: The password to the website must be entered as one word, without spaces and in lowercase letters.

 $^{\star}$  nuthatch – a bird belonging to the group of secondary cavity nesters, i.e. animals that use existing hollows - both those made by woodpeckers (primary cavity nesters) and those formed naturally, for example as a result of a tree branch breaking off.
