With your kids you can explore the twisting pathways of the Łazienki Gardens. Just take a walk and uncover many a solar secret. The map in your hands shows activities for you to do on your own. Some of them have to be done in places marked with numbers on the map, while the tasks marked with a sun symbol can be performed in any place in the gardens.

We hope that this solar trip will prove an exciting adventure.

The poem "The Conversation" will brighten your trip or rest on a bench in the shadow of garden trees.



Play with your own shadow. See, when it grows and when it shrinks.



Check, whether you have something that would reflect sun rays (e.g. a bracelet, a watch, your smartphone screen, a mirror). Try to glint with a mirror.



Observe, how plants grow in the shade and how in full sunlight.



Touch stone steps, metal lanterns or railings. Which of the surfaces is warmer?

HE SUN ROUT OLD GUARDHOUSE OLD ORANGERY • OFFICER CADET SCHOOL WHITE PAVILION H PALACE ON THE ISL 2 AMPHITHEATRE 1. Indicate how the sun NEW PALMHOUSE travels in front of the Palace on the Isle. Use the rose of the winds on the map. 2. The leaves of catalpa (a tree) resemble an umbrella. You can hide under its crown ORANGER¥ from the sun or rain. 3. Find the four sundials hidden somewhere in our gardens. Using one of them, try to count the sun rays or tell what time it is. Sundials can be found in front of the Palace on the Isle, behind the White Pavilion, on the scarp next to the Old Orangery, and somewhere in the vicinity of the New Orangery.
